We engaged local audiences through partnerships with CONTACT Photography Festival, Images Festival, TIFF Wavelengths, Oakville Galleries, Art Metropole, and DemocracyXChange; and hosted tours for 411 visitors from 27 educational and community groups. Our exhibitions received coverage in C Magazine; Esse; Blackflash Magazine; and Mousse, among others.

# **BUILDING ARTISTIC CAPACITY**

Mercer Union's activities this year highlighted the value of investing in artistic capacity and risk. Across our commissioned projects and exhibitions, each artist we worked with tested novel material approaches and presentation strategies under our dedicated curatorial and technical guidance.

A \$94.7K Capital Grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation supported the purchase of vital digital equipment for the presentation of moving-image projects and public programs. This investment ensures Mercer Union's ability to provide high-calibre technical resources for our artists, deliver exceptional exhibitions for visitors, and expand digital access to our discursive programs and in-person events.

Last December, Mercer Union celebrated our 45th Anniversary with a free community party, 45 DEGREES. Hosting 234 guests, the late-night celebration featured a lineup of local DJs, refreshments from local businesses, and installations reflecting on Mercer Union's history. The celebration was preceded by a Board-led peer-to-peer fundraising campaign, that introduced over 150 new supporters to Mercer Union, and harnessed the power of our extended community to raise over \$20K in support of our 2025 exhibitions and programs.
