

<u>Call for Applicants:</u> Lead Exhibition Preparator

- **Term:** One-year, Occasional Employee
- **Length of Assignment:** 3-week cycle of 40 hours / week, 4 times a year, in accordance with Mercer Union's exhibition schedule; additional 160 hours part-time within the year
- Location: Toronto, ON; onsite and remote work as required
- Hourly Wage: \$33 per hour worked, less applicable withholdings and statutory deductions
- Deadline: 16 February 2024

Reporting to the Assistant Curator, the Lead Exhibition Preparator is a multi-faceted role that is critical to providing expertise for exhibition planning and installation at Mercer Union. The role involves planning exhibition installations, care of artwork during shipping/receiving and while onsite, and overseeing the maintenance of facilities. The ideal candidate thrives in a fast-paced environment, adapts well to changing demands, and takes pride in performing their work with calm and precision. A dedication to supporting artists, and working passionately to see their visions come to fruition, is at the heart of their practice.

Typically, there are 4 exhibition installation periods annually. Throughout the year, the Lead Exhibition Preparator also assists with the exhibition planning prior to installation periods.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Liaise with artists, guest curators, and the Curatorial team throughout the various phases of exhibition planning and installation to identify needs regarding display and of exhibitions
- Utilize exhibition layout concept plans and renderings as communicated by Assistant Curator to formulate and execute exhibition technical plans
- Creatively solve construction and design challenges as they relate to exhibition and artwork installation
- Support planning and oversee exhibition preparation, facilitating installation for artworks in all media prior to the installation period
- Prepare installation schedules in consultation with Assistant Curator and ensure timely completion of projects
- Schedule installation technicians in consultation with Assistant Curator to ensure necessary and qualified staffing for exhibition installs
- Source installation, shipping, storage, and packaging materials, equipment, and supplies
- Field quotes and manage material and labour costs following installation-specific budget trackers
- Build exhibition materials as required, including but not limited to, plinths, display cases, shelves, and temporary walls



- Lead and implement daily de- and installation tasks, including providing supervision, guidance, and technical direction for preparators
- Oversee the packing, unpacking, lifting, and crating of artworks in the context of deand installation
- Perform condition inspections and reports of incoming and outgoing artworks; pack and crate works adhering to the highest art handling standards
- Design and implement art exhibition lighting and audiovisual components (sound and moving image installations)
- Receive incoming and outgoing shipments and deliveries, as well as personnel (artists, contractors, etc.)
- Maintain and create inventory of woodshop, storage, gallery tools, equipment, hardware, and materials needed for exhibition installations
- Prepare gallery tools, equipment, hardware, and materials for art exhibition installations
- Advise the Assistant Curator on the procurement of installation equipment and materials
- Advise the Director & Curator and Assistant Curator on issues related to the building and facilities as required
- Respond to queries about installation issues, rental of equipment, and technical issues during the course of any given exhibition
- Attend and participate in installation meetings with Curatorial staff as needed

Skills and Experience:

- Minimum of three years' experience in preparator role
- Demonstrated knowledge of art handling standards, installation, and fabrication of exhibitions, artistic material, and processes, as well as lighting standards and techniques
- Superior people management skills and knowledge of workplace safety in order to manage and supervise contract staff
- Excellent project management skills developing and adhering to timelines to manage all steps of the installation process
- Working knowledge of visual arts, professional gallery standards, as well as a willingness and interest to remain current with emerging trends
- Working knowledge of physical operations and workplace health and safety
- Experience with installation of multimedia artworks and technology within exhibitions
- Basic carpentry and woodworking skills, including experience matting and framing artworks
- Proficiency with interpreting and communicating through construction drawings, schematics, and 3D models.
- Familiarity with audio visual installation
- Experience working with Microsoft Office Suite, Google Workspace, and Sketch Up
- Excellent written, communication, administrative and organizational skills
- A valid Class G driver's license
