## **Biographies**

Parastoo Anoushahpour, Faraz Anoushahpour and Ryan Ferko have worked in collaboration since 2013. Their shared practice explores the tension of multiple subjectivities as a strategy to address the power inherent in narrative structures. Foregrounding the idea of place as a central focus, their work seeks to both decode their surroundings and trouble the production of images through speculative narration and dialectical imagery. Shifting between both gallery and cinema contexts, recent projects have been presented at Viennale, Punto De Vista International Documentary Festival, New York Film Festival, Toronto International Film Festival, and others internationally. <a href="https://www.p-f-r.com">www.p-f-r.com</a>

**Batool Elhennawy** is a writer and artist. She worked at the Cairo Institute of Liberal Arts and Sciences between 2015 and 2019 in Cairo and Alexandria. She currently works with film and is interested in intersubjective narratives, as well as possibilities of privacy within community based work dynamics. She was born in Cairo, Egypt and currently lives there.

**Batoul Ibrahim** is a creative producer and co-founder of Writers' Cell. She leads the production department which is responsible for the business labor behind the company's original series and films. She is currently producing 'Bethesda' (dark-comedy, short film) and 'She Who Lives', a bilingual existential dark-comedy feature film that is the directorial debut of writer/director Aysha El-Shamayleh.

**Bayan Kiwan** is a multidisciplinary artist whose work mostly explores female sociality and intimacy. Predominantly a painter, she seeks unaccounted for possibilities of relation and desire within preexisting square codes. Her work has been showcased as part of several group shows and residencies in Amman, Abu Dhabi, Berlin, and New York. Kiwan holds a BFA in Fine Arts from the University of Jordan, and is currently an MA candidate at NYU Gallatin School of Individualized Study. She also makes a mean cup of tea.

**Mahshid Rafiei**'s work considers the ways a process, a material and an image can become so inextricable that they ossify projections of the imaginary. Her work has been presented at Fri Art Kunsthalle, Fribourg (2018); Rheum Room, Basel (2018); and she participated in March Meeting at Sharjah Art Foundation (2019), among other discursive projects.

**Kari Rosenfeld** is an artist based in Berlin. She was a facilitator and co-founder of the Cairo Institute of Liberal Arts and Sciences in Alexandria during 2018-2019 academic year and is currently studying at Dutch Art Institute.

**Mounir-Aicha Soussan** is a Moroccan-American filmmaker from California. Their films explore the space in which grief can become ritualized and conceived as a (re)birth. Finding a liminal space between life and death, bios and geos, and their two homelands, they work to make these interstices habitable. Apart from their film practice, Mounir advocates for indigenous rights and migrant justice, primarily within the framework of US settler colonialism. They are currently completing their undergraduate degree at Bard College in New York.

**Francisco Rodríguez Teare** is an artist working in video, film and installation. He has directed the films Samanta (2014), Appels téléphoniques (2015), Una Luna de Hierro (2017), Why are They Equipped With Eyes? (2018), Goìs (2020), amongst others.

**merve ünsal** is a visual artist based in Istanbul. in her work, she employs text and photography, extending both beyond their form. she is the founding editor of the artist-driven initiative <u>m-est.org</u>
